Latest on LAA data breach

The LAA has now published their latest update on the cyber-attack with a contingency plan for payments to reflect anticipated income from civil certificated work (called Average Payments for Civil Representation Scheme) and confirmation that LGFS and AGFS claims assessment has now recommenced. We have included the main changes since the last LAA update on 22 May 2025 below in case you didn't receive an email directly from the LAA.

You can find their latest comms here which includes a Q&A section and details of the new contingency process for civil billing including a guide to how this will work.

<u>Civil Billing</u>

scheme, and process for opting into it, can be found here.

This scheme requires providers to opt-in to the process, so please do review and follow the guidance if you want to receive payments through this mechanism. You will shortly receive an email with details of the average payment for your accounts.

<u>Crime Billing</u>

Graduated fee (LGFS and AGFS) claim assessment has now recommenced, and payments will begin next week. Please continue to submit bills via CCCD in the normal way. We have already communicated contingency arrangements for CRM4s, CRM5s and CRM7s.

The opt-in process referred to above requires you to take positive action, as set out in the accompanying guidance, and includes a declaration to be submitted with your request. Please read the guidance carefully and contact us if you have any concerns.

We are still waiting to hear from the LAA whether there is a planned contingency coming for billing escape fee cases, submitting bills, POA requests and amending certificates. We know that many firms are reliant on income from escape cases alongside certificated billing.
